7.2.2.1 Title of the practice: Learning beyond the Classroom

7.2.2.2 Objectives of the Practice

- 1. To cultivate an atmosphere of sharing of knowledge among the Students.
- 2. To motivate the students to update themselves endlessly that in turn leads to modernize their knowledge.
- 3. To enhance the soft skills as presentation, exposition, technical specialities, mastery over giving interview and many more.
- 4. To bring cohesiveness among the students.
- 5. To come up with some unique and new concepts so that it will be helpful to students in comprehensive ways.
- 6. To have plenty of interaction among all students and also to learn to give a lots of thought to their audio visual aids.
- 7. To facilitate learning and development among all.

7.2.2.3 The context

St. Vincent Pallotti College has a number of departments having skilled and experienced faculties. The progressive culture of the college demands a continuous updation of information in various fields. To fulfil these requirements, college operates a unique approach to benefit the students. It is known as **'Learning beyond the classroom'.** In this activity, all the departments identify the needs of the students those fall beyond the range of regular syllabus but are essential for their development and vocational justification. This methodology helps in developing some new insights into different commercial, technical, social, moral and cultural issues. The topic ranges from a vast variety of skills as presentation, exposition, technical specialities, mastery over giving interview and many more.

7.2.2.4 The Practice

St. Vincent Pallotti College has a regular practice of conducting such add-on activities since many years. The execution of learning beyond classroom has been one of the best practices of the college and this practice has brought amazing results. The philosophy behind this practice is to see the learning as a continuous dynamic process. The students learn in best way when they are kept engaged in a variety of well structured activities and this in turn generate great results.

The concept of learning beyond classroom was introduced because such practices allow the educators and the students, to let out their creativity through each relevant opportunity. Students must have impeccable skills sets for piquing the different aspects of their personal and professional life. Every department of the college devotes an exclusive span of time in weekly or monthly manner for these sessions.

To strengthen skills, focus lies on improving skills in these three areas:

- Verbal and Non-Verbal Communication.
- Effective use of the presentation skills and Visual-Aids
- Effective Design and Meaningful Organization of Contents
- To practice the technical skills sets.

The success of a teaching session is dependent on multiple factors, including adequate preparation, the balance of learners' needs with educational goals, active participant learning led by a skilled facilitator, and appropriate assessment of the session's educational outcomes.

Following are the main thrust areas of various departments in this context:

Commerce Department:

a. <u>Career Prospects of Company Secretary</u>

The department of commerce had conducted the seminar on "Career Prospect of CS (company sectary)". The guest speaker was Mr. Sharad Kankani, CA, CS and CMA. He described about the nature of examination of about programs and how to attempt in company secretary examination in detail

b. Case Study Activity: Rags to Riches

Company Law case study activity was conducted by Department of Commerce for B.Com 2nd year students on 29 November 2021 named as "Rags to Riches". Case study helps in bringing the understanding of a complex issue or object and provides an in-depth investigation of one particular individual, group, time-period or event. Case studies, though factual, are people-focused and less formal, making them more interesting for people to read. Based on real benefits, it can create immediate credibility among the listeners.

c. Grooming The Personality

The present activity was organized virtually by the Department of Commerce on "Grooming the Personality". All the students of B.Com, BBA, BCA, B.Ed, B.P.Ed participated with their great zeal and motivation. Arrangements were made for students in AVA room for attending the session and for others to join using Zoom and YouTube link. Mr. Lakshya (Target), Director Brainwash was invited as a guest speaker to make students aware about the need and ways to groom their personality.

Department of Education:

a. ALM Workshop

A three days' workshop is conducted in the college for the students of Education Department - Semester III on **25**, **26** and **27** October **2021**. A proper timetable of all the methods to be taught is prepared along with the names of the supervising teachers. It is to acquaint and make student- teachers better equipped with new methods and techniques of teaching learning, their use and to enhance the learning and creativity of the student-teachers in the field of teaching-learning process.

b. Exhibition of Educational Toys

The exhibition showcased the innovative side of students. The educational toys displayed were helpful in developing a fun learning environment for students. The toys were submitted for evaluation in the Nai Talim lab.

c. Workshop on Technological Integration in Instructional Practices

The workshop discussed ways to connect with students, share resources, and enrich a course with Educational Apps. The students learnt and discussed the applications available for mobile devices and ways to use them. This workshop exposed teacher trainees with multiple uses of Educational Applications for teaching and learning.

d. Yoga for Wellness

Department of education of St. Vincent palloti college has celebrated international yoga day on 21st June 2021 virtually in the zoom application. The event was started with Om chanting by yoga teacher Mr. Anil Kumar Chandrakar. Different yoga postures were taught by the instructor. The benefits of Asanas and postures were also explained to everyone.

Department of Computer Science:

a. World Computer Literacy Day

World Computer Literacy Day is observed on **2nd December** every year all over the world. Department of Computer Science has celebrated this day by engaging students of BCA-I and PGDCA. 4 Groups of 5 students each from the mentioned classes were formed namely Team PARAM, Team INTERPRETER, Team TECHNOWLEDGE, and Team the A Team. These teams had visited different classes and departments of the college and shared technical facts and knowledge with them.

b. Inter-Disciplinary Activity - "Technical Carnival by Tech Savvy Students

To create awareness about Science and Technology, the Department of Computer Science had organized an activity "Technical Carnival By Tech-Savvy Students" on 30/11/2021, where all the students of various departments participated and shown their talent with their innovative ideas.

c. Quiz Competition

The Department organized an event named 'Quiz Competition'. The objective of conducting 'Quiz Competition' is to encourage students to develop competitive environment among students beyond the syllabus knowledge. Quiz competitions enable students to think out of the box. It promotes a healthy debate amongst participants in order to learn from each other

d. PPT Presentation Competition

The Department organized an event named "**PPT Presentation Competition**". The basic purpose of organizing this competition is to inculcate and boost corporate communication, develop public speaking, encourage self-learning amongst the students. Developing presentation skills in the classroom is important for improving communication and creating positive learning experiences. This activity is helpful to gain real-world skills such as the ability to present accomplishments and skills during a job interview.

e. Technical Antakshari

The purpose of organizing this event was to have an informal interaction with new students of BCA and PGDCA and to make them feel comfortable with the teachers as well as senior students.

Department of Management:

a. BIZMAP

A team building activity has been conducted by the department of management. The activity aimed to generate ideas and encourage students. The student participants were supposed to design complete business strategies for an imaginary product. This activity gave a platform to showcase and groom the management skills to students.

b. Guest Lecture-Fit and Healthy lifestyle for adaptability of Management Skills In this activity, students were enlightened about various aspects of health and fitness. The expert Dr. Geetika emphasized the need of balanced diet and physical exercise for adaptation of management skills.

c. Quiz Competition

BBA III semester students successfully conducted an inter house quiz competition for the students of BBA I and V semester students. The students showcased their brilliance by rapidly answering their questions.

7.2.2.5 Evidence of Success

The practice remains highly effective. Many new ideas and concepts were introduced and presented in such a way that the entire department got engrossed. After each activity, feedback is received from students. The feedback contains most of the assertive comments for the activities in addition to this department receives few constructive suggestions. The suggestion act as catalyst to bring further improvement in the selection and execution of activities. This way the whole activity rolls on a self-enhancing cycle.

The most profound evidence of the above initiative is the achievements of our students. - Some activities were lengthy and hence the students could not pay attention.



II Posintion-Swati Ghritlahere & Group who made an innovative "VAYU- Air Parifier".




